

## SELECTED BIBLIOGRAPHY

### Newspapers

Kansas City newspapers recorded the public history of the Liberty Memorial thoroughly. That voluminous record was preserved in Press Clipping books by J. E. McPherson, LMA Secretary, 1918-1938, and is in the Liberty Memorial Museum Library and Archives. In most cases there are no page numbers.

The morning Kansas City Journal and the evening Kansas City Post published the Kansas City Journal-Post on Sunday. In 1929, the two papers merged to become the Kansas City Journal-Post, an evening newspaper. After 1939, that newspaper became the Kansas City Journal. Publication ceased in 1942.

The Kansas City Times is the morning newspaper of the Kansas City Star Company which publishes the evening and Sunday Kansas City Star.
